 all my negro slaves! the plantation on which I now reside
 also a tract of land, adjoining the above containing

seven, five hundred by one seven thirty of front
 all my land not before before disposed of, I give down and
 bequeath to my nephew, William H. Jones, James Jones and
 my niece Michael Jones, to be equally divided between
 them, should they then alive, as tenants in common, and in
 case of the death of either of the before named William H.
 Jones, James Jones or Michael Jones before arriving at age
 or death to such success, it to go to, and be equally divided
 as between the survivors, and in case of the death of
 James and Michael Jones, then the property hereby given is
 to vest in the survivors above, but so long as to survive
 them. I give to my nephew, William H. Jones, my gold
 watch, chain and fob.

Lastly I hereby appoint my beloved wife Ann Powell,
 executrix of, and John Elliott, John Burwood and David
 I leave, Executors to this my last will and testament.
