I give all the property, that I may be possessed of at my decease to Andrew Bogart Baker, unless I should have a wife; then, and in that case, I give him all the property that I got by his mother Mary Ann Baker. The rest I give to her; and in case I should have children, I wish them that all my property to be equally divided between my wife and children, except my lands, which I give to my child or children. Should I die without leaving wife or children, and Andrew Bogart Baker die without wife or children, I wish them that all my property be kept together, and after the support of the negroes, the nett proceeds of the crops to be applied to the support of missionaries, and other religious causes. I wish my negroes well treated. I do hereby leave my much esteemed friends, William L. Baker, for Norman & George W. Walther, my executors to this my last will & testament. In witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
