Martin, orphans of Alexander Martin, late of said County deceased, Now, if the said Simon Dorer Sen. do well and truly demean himself as guardian aforesaid, agreeably to letters of guardianship bearing even date herewith, and agreeably to law in such case made and provided, the above obligation to be void; otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

In the name of God Amen. I John S. Quenteman, of the State & County aforesaid, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, & being of sound & perfect mind & memory, do make & publish this my last will & testament in manner & form following, viz.

I do give & bequeath unto my beloved wife, Susan Quenteman, my house & lot on Geny's Hill, my negro woman slave named Jenny, her daughter Hannah, & her son Moss, carriage & horses now in my possession, & large bureau. Also, the privilege of planting as much as her hands can stand of the lands which I may have after give to my sons, Richard & Stewart, so long as she remains my widow.

I do hereby give & bequeath unto my daughter Susan Quenteman, my negro woman slave named Moses,

I do hereby give & bequeath unto my three children, Leticia, Clarissa & George, & my small bureau. Also, the privilege of planting as much as the hands can attend of the lands which I may hereafter give to my two sons Richard & Stewart, so long as the revenues amount.

2^d I do hereby give & bequeath unto my son Stewart Lafayette, my plantation tract of land, containing three hundred acres, together with all improvements & appurtenances thereto belonging, making a reserve in favor of my wife & daughter, as specified above. Also, one other tract of four land, containing one hundred & thirty four acres, lately purchased from Richard T. Baker, bounded by lands of John & Richard St. James Stacy; reserving as above. Also, my negro boy Simbo, my patent lever watch, & double barreled gun.

3^d I do hereby give & bequeath unto my son Richard Lawrence, all that parcel of land lately bought from Richard T. Baker (excepting one hundred & thirty four acres, given above to Stewart Lafayette) containing about two hundred & fifty acres, together with all privileges & appurtenances thereto belonging, making a reserve in favor of my wife & daughter, as specified above. Also, my negro boy Rob, and negro girl Diana, and old silver watch.

4th I do hereby give & bequeath unto my son William Elliott May, all that tract of land which he now plants, containing about two hundred & four acres, called Lane-Patch, my house-clock, and negro woman called Old Hope.

5th I do hereby give & bequeath unto my grand daughter Ann Jones, my negro girl called Diana.

6th All of my house & kitchen furniture, I wish to be equally divided between my wife & daughter.

7th All the rest, residue & remainder of my property, both personal and real, after all of my lawful & just debts shall have been paid, I wish to be equally divided between my wife & children, in such manner, that William Elliott May's part shall contain all or as many of the negroes now in his possession as shall be necessary to make his lot equal to the rest.

8th All of the above legacies & bequests, I do hereby give unto the above mentioned legates, to them & their heirs forever.

9th I do hereby appoint & constitute my son William C. W. Duntomon executor, my wife Susan Duntomon executrix, & also my friends John Stacy & Richard C. Bessels executors, to this my last will & testament, making all wills by me heretofore made.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this fourth day of March eighteen hundred and thirty six.

MS. The words "and negro girl Diana" in the bequest to Richard Lawrence interlined before my signature were effaced.
