All the property included in the above items, to wit, Item 1st both personal and real, I give and bequeath to my son Edmund Bacon Way, to be his and at his disposal, at twenty one years of age.

Item 2^d The balance of my property, both personal and real, I leave to my wife Elizabeth and the children I now have, or may have by her, to be equally divided among them.

Item 3^d Each of my children shall claim the cattle which I have minked for them, and those cattle shall be considered as no part of my estate.
