Georgia and County of Liberty being of sound mind and memory and knowing that
I am appointed with all Men Once to die, do make this my last Will and Testament.
1st I desire that my funeral Charges and all my just and lawful debts be paid
2nd I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Rebecca my Negro Wench named Betsy
my best riding Chair, a Choice of my Horses, the choice of my Distaffs, and for
two for the same, and all of my Silver Spoons, in lieu of her lawful Portion to
her, her Heirs and Assigns forever - I also give for the use of one third
part of my dwelling House, and a sufficient Quantity of Land for her Negro place
(provided she continues there on my plantation) Also I give for my wench named Betsy
a new wooden wheel she remains my lawful Wench - If she my said wife should
die to occupy any part of my house on the Islands Islands, she shall be bound
the use of one of the Rooms in said House which shall be chosen by herself
I give and bequeath unto my Son John, the Tract of land on which
I now resides, containing One Hundred and fifty Acres more or less to him his
Heirs and Assigns forever - I give and bequeath to my Son William the Tract
of land purchased of Doctor Henry Wood containing One hundred and twenty six
containing One hundred and twenty six Acres of land more or less lying between
Old Daniel Newarts and Nicobers, To him his heirs and Assigns forever.
I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary, my Negro Wench called Betsy
Nanny, to her, her Heirs and Assigns forever - I give and bequeath
to my Daughter Esther, my Negro Wench named Betsy, to her her Heirs and Assigns
forever - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth, two of my Negro
Girls vizt Binah & Salasah to her, her Heirs and Assigns forever. I give
I give to my Son John I give to my Grand Daughter Mary Anne
Ogden my Negro Girl Rose, to her, her Heirs and Assigns forever.

We John, I give to my son John my last will and testament — As I have given my son
 Mary a house and lot at New York and I give and bequeath to my daughter Anne
 Elizabeth fifty dollars each, to make equal. And further, all the
 of my Estate I wish divided equally among my wife and Children
 named, with the exception, that my Grand Daughter Mary Ann Osgood
 have a half share, that is to my half as much of the last mentioned
 of my Estate that is to be divided among the whole as one of my own Children
 to be their share and mine forever. The lands I possess in North
 York County on the Master Patent I wish sold and the proceeds above my
 wife's share is, that my wife shall have little Samory at the
 -ment and my son shall have to have Flora, with the other at the
 -ment is part of their inheritance. I do by this my last will and testament
 authorize my son William, to act for himself, and to take the proper
 his possession which I have bequeathed him at the age of nineteen years
 daughters and Grand Daughters, shall be allowed to take their parts at

 William, to be the Executor of this my last will and testament and do utterly revoke and annul
