 bequeath and my beloved son, Thomas Mallard, with
 his heirs, or fourth part, of that tract of land, with
 entire protection, or fourth part, of that tract of land,
 on which he now resides, also my said, or half of that
 house and lot on the Island of St. John, my negro
 man, Frank, and his brother Sam, together with
 my negro girl, the four volumes of Scott's Tales,
 Bible and my silver cups to him and his heirs forever.
 Item I give and bequeath with my grand daughter,
 Eliza Mallard, my negro woman, Susan, to be delivered
 to her at the age of sixteen years, or on the day
 of her marriage. - Item, I give and bequeath with
 my grand daughter, Anna Mallard, my said son,
 John, to be delivered to her at the age of sixteen years,
 or day of marriage. Item I give and bequeath with
 my grand son, John B. Mallard, my negro boy, Sam,
 to be delivered to him at the age of sixteen years,
 or day of marriage. - I give and bequeath with
 my grand daughter, Mary Mallard, my negro boy,
 John, to be delivered to her at the age of sixteen
 years, or day of marriage. Item I give also with
 my grand son, John B. Mallard, my tract of land, or
 one of the branches of Jordan, containing one hundred
 acres, more or less, to become his property at the
 age of sixteen years, or day of marriage. Item, I
 give and bequeath with my grand daughter, Sarah
 B. Mallard, my negro girl, Phoebe, to be delivered to her
 at the age of sixteen years, or day of marriage. Item I
 give and bequeath with my grand daughter, Mary
 E. Mallard, my negro girl, Will, to be delivered to her
 at the age of sixteen years, or day of marriage. - Item
 It is my desire, that in case any of my grand children
 should die before they shall arrive to the age, at which
 I have appointed them to receive their legacies, that the
 portions, or legacies, bequeathed to such child, or children,
 shall be equally divided between the surviving
 brothers and sisters, being brothers or sisters by the father

side only. - Item I give and bequeath with my
 son, Thomas Mallard, one half of the remainder
 of my estate, to him and his heirs forever. Item
 I give and bequeath with my daughter, in her
 half of my estate, to her and her heirs forever.
 Item I give and bequeath with my grand daughter,
 Eliza, Anna, John and Mary Mallard, the
 remaining part of my estate, to them and their
 heirs forever. It be delivered to them at the age
 of sixteen years, or marriage. - I hereby renounce
 and affirm my son, Thomas Mallard, and
 my friend, William Nelson, executors of this my
 last will and testament, hereby revoking all
 other wills made by me. In testimony whereof,
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 6th
 month of February in the year of our Lord
 one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, and in
 the thirty eighth year of American Independence.
