First of all, my body to be committed to the dust, to be buried at the discretion of my friends. First of all, I give and bequeath to my loving wife my plantation and mill, and the tract of land on which I now live, during her widowhood, or till my youngest daughter comes to eighteen years of age; my wife to possess the above said premises during her life or widowhood. At her death to be sold, and equally divided among my heirs. My wife to have and own all the property she possessed before our marriage, with all she may accumulate by her own industry, with all my plantation tools, with her choice of horses I may possess at my death. - Secondly, I give and bequeath to my daughter, Susan Susan Louisa Christina one certain cow called Hornpipe, one called Nags, and one called Plum, with their increase, one heifer called Banek, one big pot; all take taken care of for her till she comes of age. - Thirdly, All the rest of my property to be sold, and, when my debts are paid, equally divided between my first wife's children. - I hereby con-
secrate and ordain my loving wife Zephah Morgan, my [son] Gabriel Morgan, and Duncan Buchanan, my only sole executors. - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of April 1800, and in the fifty fourth year of American Independence.
