and knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to die do make and Ordain this
my last Will and Testament, that is to say - principally and first of all I give
and recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it. And
my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at
the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God - And as touching
my worldly Estate wherein it has pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise
and dispose of the same in the following manner and form - After all my
just debts and funeral expenses be paid - then I give and bequeath to my
lawfully beloved Wife Betsey Children, Samuel, Mary, Sarah, Susannah
Eliza Ann & John all my Estate both real and personal that I shall be possessed
of at the time of my decease to be equally divided between them share & share
alike - And after the decease of my dear Wife, then her Share to be equally
divided among the Children before named - And in case of any or either of the
Children should die without issue, then their share or portions shall be
equally divided among the rest of the Children as aforesaid - And lastly
I constitute and appoint my dearly beloved Wife - my son Samuel - and my
son James Smart Executors of this my last Will and Testament And I do
fully utterly, disallow revoke and Repeal all and every other former
Testaments, Wills, Legacies, bequests and Executors by me in anywise before
made, written and bequeathed - Ratifying and Confirming this and
