Liberty County } County and State aforesaid, widow, being of sound mind, memory
and understanding, do make this my last will and testament in manner and form fol-
lowing, viz. I give to my grand daughter, Frances A. Baker, and to her heirs forever,
my negro woman named Melvina, and her daughter Georgiana, together with their future issue.
I give, devise and bequeath all the residue of my property or estate, after the payment
of my just debts, as follows, viz.

I give & bequeath to my friends, John Dunwoody and John O. Baker, in trust for the
benefit and use of my grand children by my son William T. Laddson, the following negroes, viz.
Jacob, Jerry, Affy, Walter, Lydia, Adeline and Mariah, together with such other negro or negroes
as I may hereafter purchase and add to my property, in the place of the woman Nancy whom I
have sold, & together with their future issue, in the following manner; viz. It is my wish that
the above negro property be employed as my friends above named shall deem best, and the net
proceeds applied to the maintenance and support of said children, in common, untill the boys
shall successively arrive at the age of seventeen; and as each boy arrives at that age, his claim to
support from the above property shall cease; and when the youngest boy shall have reached that
age of seventeen, then, that the above property be equally divided between the female children,
to them and to their heirs forever.

I give and bequeath one half of the remainder of my property to John Dunwoody &
John O. Baker, in trust for my grand daughter Rosina L. Minton, and it is my wish, that
my friends, John Dunwoody & John O. Baker, have the full & perfect control of the above one
half of my property, together with the increase and annual income of the same, & their executors
or administrators, for the above Rosina L. Minton, during her marriage with Major J. Minton;
and at his death, the said portion of one half to be equally divided between the said Rosina
and her children. But in case she dies first, then the said property to be equally divided
between her children, to them and their heirs forever.

I give and bequeath the remaining other half of my property to my grand daughter Sarah
D. Latham, and to her heirs forever.

I leave my faithful ^{white} servant, Old Cissy in charge of my friends John O. Baker & Francis
A. Baker his wife.

I nominate and appoint my friends, John Dunwoody and John O. Baker, executors of this
my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hands and seals,
and deliver it this seventh day of June in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and
thirty four.

1st I give and bequeath unto my daughters, Elizabeth, Ann & Mary, the lot of land drawn by me in the late Land Lottery in the County of Cherokee, together with all the personal property of which I may be seized in my own right at my decease of every kind whatsoever, to be by them shared equally, to them and their heirs forever.

2^d It is my will that the fractional lot lately drawn to my name, should be sold by my executor, and divided equally among my children which are now living, and the children of those which are dead, each family of orphans of my deceased children to have a part equal to my children which are living.

And lastly, I hereby appoint my son Robert Hendry executor of this my last will and testament.
