

But should my said wife Mary M'Collough die having no children or children of her own, and should my brother at that time be alive, or should he have any issue, lawfully begotten alive then, and should those come to take place, I will assign that part of my Negro Property that I receive from my Father's Estate viz; James M'Collough that I reserve and become the property of my brother James M'Collough or his children as the case may be, otherwise I reserve to be disposed of with the other property which I desire to my wife, and to be at her disposal.

Her it understood that the Negro's here spoken of as received from the estate of my Father & which I reserve to my Brother, should contain every one of which place, day, not, and is not intended to comprehend that part, that I have already sold or that may hereafter be necessarily sold for the payment of debts that may be due by me, or my Estate.

And further I do hereby appoint and constitute my well beloved wife Mary M'Collough (aforesaid) Executrix, and my brother in law John Bigord (aforesaid) of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and disannulling all other Wills and Legacies by me heretofore made and acknowledging and declaring by me here no other to be my last Will and Testament.
