that gave it through the merits of Jesus Christ. It is my will and desire, that my funeral expences, and all and every my just and lawful debts be paid and satisfied. And as to what worldly estate it

hath pleased God to bless me with, I give, devise and bequeath in manner following: I give, devise and bequeath unto my friend Morgan Marsh, planter of Liberty County, the following negro slaves; namely,

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 I give, devise and bequeath to my friend, Martha
 Carter, daughter of John Carter, three negroes, to wit:
 namely, Lily, Dolly and Patsy, to her and her
 heirs forever. I give, devise and bequeath to my
 young friend, James Carter, a negro boy
 named Peter, and his free, to him forever. I give,
 devise and bequeath to the daughter of John Carter,
 a negro girl named Sarah, forever, and her heirs
 forever. It is my further will and desire, that after the
 expiration of two years after my death and death of
 my son, James and bequeath unto John Carter, the son
 of Richard Carter, the sum of four hundred dollars
 as a mark of friendship towards him. I do hereby
 nominate, constitute and appoint Morgan Smith
 and John Stewart, both of the County of Liberty,
 my executors of this my last will and testament.
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and affixed my seal, this the sixth (6th) day of Dec-
 ember in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred
 and nineteen.
