Item, The tract or tracts of land where I now re-
side adjoining my brother John Osgood, Wm.
Peacock, and others; I give & bequeath to my son
Samuel.

Item. I make the following tracts of land in three
lots to be divided as follow, viz. one tract of land
on Cananachie adjoining lands of the estate
of Hugh Bennett to make one lot, one other tract
of land on the Alatomaha River on the lower end
of Beard's bluff, to make a second lot, and two
tracts in Glynn County on turtle river adjoining
each other & said to be adjoining lands of
Liberty County to make the third lot. One

of said will to be devised for my daughter Mary
for my son Joseph children. And the other part
grandson William D. Graham - "his part of land
on Beaver Creek, Mitchell County, Georgia, being the
three hundred acres near the estate of Matthew
Beumiller's commission by Harwin by the name of
Guthrie's property to be sold and added to my personal
estate -

I then I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary
one negro girl named Flora, to my son Samuel
one boy named Isaac, to my grand daughter
I bequeath one girl named Rachel, to my grand
to Mary Ann bequeath one girl named Abigail, to
grandson Wm D. Graham one girl named Bessie
to my grandson Matthew Beumiller one boy named John
and to my grand daughter Sarah O. Beumiller one
girl named Sucky. And further all my wearing
apparel to my son Samuel. My right in the
my meeting house not to be divided but to be
equally enjoyed by all my children & grand
children, my son Samuel being first supplied

Then I give & bequeath to my nephew John Butler
the sum of twenty dollars - My other negroes
except for his good services done in my family
& if she continues to behave herself well & is
criminal practice laid against her, I substitute
and give her freedom the first day of April
eighteen hundred & seven

Then all the remainder of my estate real &
personal to be divided in four equal divisions,
one of said divisions I give & bequeath to my daughter
Mary, one to my son Samuel, one to my
son Josiah children & the other to my grand
son Wm D. Graham but my will further is
that my son Josiah's widow shall enjoy an
equal share in all that I have given & be-
queathed to his children, with them, during
her natural life. All that I have given to
my children & grand children as is mentioned
in this my last will & testament, is to them
and the heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten
forever - And further I will that all dying
shares shall be equally divided among the
surviving heirs, only that if either of my son
Josiah's children should die without an heir

portion that is now allotted them both - I have
 James Graham have the use of the part that is
 given to my son A. M. A. Graham until he is
 age, or marries, and before that time
 My grandchildren I make of age to receive
 portion at the following ages: some at twenty
 daughters at eighteen or marriage - And I make
 my will & devise is that as soon as my body
