In the name of God. Amen. I Palmer Goulding, of Liberty County, State of Georgia,  
being in perfect mind and memory, knowing that it is appointed for all men once to  
die, do make and order this my last will and testament, that is to say, principally,  
and first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who  
gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial,  
at the discretion of my executors. As to my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased  
God to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following  
manner and form, my just debts being first paid. I give and bequeath unto my  
younger daughter, Mary Jane Goulding, one half of my estate, both real and personal,  
but should my said daughter Mary Jane depart this life without leaving lawful issue,  
the said property, both real and personal, shall then be vested in the children or child,  
as the case may be, of my daughter Susan Jane Thomson.

I give and bequeath unto Susan Jane Thomson, and her children, the other half of my estate,  
both real and personal, to be divided, the one half to my daughter Susan Thomson, and  
the other half to my grand children. Should any of my grand children depart this life  
without leaving lawful heirs, then its part to be divided equally between my daughter  
Susan Thomson, and her surviving child or children.

I also will that my daughter Mary Jane Goulding live with Susan Thomson until  
she is of age or married.

I likewise constitute and ordain my daughter Susan Jane Thomson, and my friend  
Ureah Wilcox, executors of this my last will and testament. And I do hereby utterly  
disallow, revoke and disannul all former wills and testaments by me made, ratifying  
and confirming this, and no other, to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof
