the uncertainty of the duration of human life, do make and
ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, principally
and first, I recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it,
bequeathing his gracious mercies thereof, and my Body to
the ground from whence it came, at the direction of my
Executors herein after named. And as touching my worldly
Estate, I give and dispose of in manner following that is to
say, I Give unto my daughter Ann Elizabeth Irvine, wife
of Doctor John Irvine, a mourning Ring and my full suit of
Mourning linnen. Item, I give and bequeath all and
singular the Estate Real and Personal that I am in any
wise entitled unto, from, or in the Estate of my said deceased
Husband, unto Charles Irvine, my Grand Son, Artemus Baker,
who married my Grand daughter Euphemia Darling, and
James Bullock, who married unto Ann Irvine my Grand
daughter, and Daughter to Doctor John Irvine aforesaid, to
them and their Heirs, share and share alike.

Item, I give and bequeath my Tract of Land, adjoining
Lands of Roger P. Samuels in Newport Liberty County
aforesaid, containing five hundred Acres be the same more
or less, unto my said Executors in Trust, to and for the
following purpose and Intent, that is to say, to be disposed
of when ever it will bring or sell for three pounds Sterling per
Acre, and untill the same will sell for that price, to
rent or hire it out to the best advantage, and the monies
arising therefrom, in either case, to be laid out in prime
Young Negroes, to be improved in the best manner for
the Benefit of my Estate, and the same to be divided into
four parts and distributed in the manner following, viz.

The right part of the money in 1790 was
 from the sale or lease of the said tract of land and was
 paid into the said Bank, and was by order of the
 Bank, paid to the said Charles and Elizabeth his wife. An other
 part of the money in 1790 was received from the sale
 or lease of another tract of land ... to have Elizabeth's daughter
 Charles's daughter of William Baker and Elizabeth Baker
 had in care of her mother under the age of eighteen years
 one of the money in 1790 was paid to the said part of said Bank
 to the said Elizabeth's daughter of Charles and Elizabeth Baker
 of ... she was the part of the money in 1790 was
 received from the sale or lease of land ... of said tract
 ... same son of John and Anne Elizabeth Baker
 to be in support of her Education. And one other and
 last part of the money in 1790 was received from
 the sale or lease of said tract of land as aforesaid ...
