I Rebecca Osgood, of the County of Liberty in the State of Georgia, widows being old and infirm, do make my last will and testament in the following manner. - I give and bequeath to Mr Thomas Mallard, with whom I reside, my negro Edward, and my four wheel carriage, and in consideration of his kindness and attention, I give and bequeath to him the said Thomas Mallard the sum of four hundred dollars, if there should be so much due on his note from him to me. If there should not be so much due on said note, I then give and bequeath to him the balance that shall be found due.

I give and bequeath to my niece Rebecca E. Mallard my five dogs, shoot and traps.

I give and bequeath ^{my bureau} to Amanda Caroline, and Rebecca Ann, daughters of my nephew William Quatorman Baker.

I give and bequeath to my said nephew William E. Baker the remainder of my estate, to him, his heirs and assigns forever; my said nephew to pay out of my estate to my brother Elijah Baker, annually, during his natural life, three shares of the net proceeds of the labor or hire of the working slaves herein bequeathed to him, after first deducting my said brother's proportion of the expense of food, clothing, taxes, medicine and medical attendance, and other necessary expenses of the said laboring slaves.

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I constitute and appoint my said nephew William L. Baker, executor of this my last will and testament.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this tenth day of July in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty.

Item 2^d I do further give to my dear mother Elizabeth Baker, and brothers Artemas Baker, Samuel Baker, John Baker and Richard Baker, the following property, two feather beds, two mattresses, gig, one foot gun, waggon, cart, andirons, plough, grindstone, glass and crockery ware, share and share alike.

Item 3^d It is my will, that all of my interest, claim, right and title, to lands belonging to the estates of William J. Baker and William W. Baker be equally divided between my mother, and brothers, Artemas Baker, Samuel Baker, John Baker and Richard Baker.

Item 4th It is my desire, that all of my interest, right and claim to stocks of cattle & hogs, belonging to the estates of William J. Baker and William W. Baker, be equally divided between my mother Elizabeth Baker, and my brothers, Artemas Baker, Samuel Baker, John Baker and Richard Baker.

Item 5th and lastly, I do appoint my mother Elizabeth Baker, Artemas Baker, Samuel Baker & Thomas L. Cassels, executrix and executors to this my last will and testament, disannulling all other wills and testaments heretofore made by me.
