

Dear Sir,

Savannah July 7th 1857

I enclose to you the Order of the Supreme Court of your County in the Case of Wm. Sandiford, with an affidavit of the signatures of Copies on the Creditor's - Publication has been made in the Columbian Mustard which paper I presume can be had at Peabody's without the necessity of my sending it out - if it can not, I will send it upon being requested to do so -

Mr Joseph Jones intimated to me that Mr Sandiford was desirous I should attend the Justice at the time appointed in the Order - but I cannot presume to do so - duty which will interfere to prevent his liberation. - All that will be necessary will be to show that notice has been served upon Creditor accordingly to the Order - the Court will then take their Care that he receives the Benefit of the Act - - If any Opposition should be expected & they will inform me of it & require my attendance I must endeavor to go out -
