 County State of Georgia before being in an infirm state of
 body, but of sound mind & memory, knowing it is almost
 impossible for me to live, do make and ordain that my last
 will & testament, that is to say, Inasmuch as I fear of the
 Lord and recommend my soul into the hands of the
 Almighty God, that you it and my body I recommend to
 be buried in decent Christian burial, at
 the discretion of my executors, and as to my worldly
 estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in
 this life, I give, devise & bequeath of the same in the fol-
 lowing manner & form viz. I give and bequeath to my
 dear loved & favored son, John & Edward, two
 sons & after, a set of silver teaspoons.

I give and bequeath to my nephew, Samuel Spencer,
 two slaves, Kitty & Little Jack, half of my cattle & sheep, &
 one hundred dollars and money to be paid on one year
 after my death.

I give and bequeath to Mary J. Bacon, who resides with
 me, my horse & chaise.

I give and bequeath to my nephew Ben Spencer, all
 my remaining property of every description, both real &
 personal, on condition that he pay all my just & lawful
 debts, and I hereby give to Charles J. Spencer & Eliza

my daughter of Joseph Bacon, the sum of one hundred
 and fifteen each, if they live to the age of eighteen.
 I likewise constitute and make and ordain my nephew, Ben
 my executor & Joseph Spencer, the executors of the very
 last will & testament, and I do hereby fully discharge and
 release all persons with & testament by me made,
 & testament, I do hereby release, I have released, and my
 heirs & next of kin, this fifth day of March in the year of our
 Lord & sealed in presence of
