In this hope and confidence I render up my soul with comfort, believing in a triumphant Guide, most holy, most merciful, and gracious to prepare me for the time of my depolation, and then to take me to himself, into that peace and rest and incomparable felicity which he has prepared for all who love and fear his holy Name, Blessed Amen, Blessed be God. In witness whereof I give my body to the earth from whence it was taken, in full assurance of its resurrection, from thence at the last day. As for my heretofore I desire that it may be decent, let my Estate I will and positively order that all my just debts be paid. I then first. It is my will that all my estate, Real and personal be equally divided among my beloved children and my beloved wife, Jane Parker, who is now in a state of pregnancy, if safely delivered, for it to share equally with the rest, And if any of the children should die before it arrives to manhood or womanhood, then that survivor shall have their estate. As for my children, it may desire that my Executors herein after named shall raise and educate my children out of the proceeds of my estate, And do hereby appoint Wm H Parker and Stephen Parker, executors of this my last will and Testament trusting that they will manage the same with requisite prudence, Signed with my hand and seal this 19th April Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred forty four
