the County of Liberty and State aforesaid, being of sound
mind and memory, but in a languishing state of bodily
health, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, to
the end that I may rid myself of all secular concerns at
the solemn hour of death, do now make, ordain and de-
clare this my last will and testament, hereby, revoking and
making void all former wills at any time heretofore made.
And first, and principally, I desire to commit the welfare
of my precious & immortal soul into the hands of my all-
wise and gracious Creator, hoping for his mercy, towards me,
solely on account of the infinite sacrifice made by the Son
of God for the salvation of all who believe on him, &
trust in his righteousness alone for their justification.
My frail body I commit to the grave, to be buried at
the discretion of my executors, hereafter to be named.
All my property I devise to my son John Francis Webb,
to him and his heirs forever, unless he should die with-
out lawful issue, or before he has attained to the age of
