Bogart County } In the name of God Amen. I Mary Ann Miller, of Liberty
 County in the State of Georgia, widow of William Thomas Miller, late of Chatham
 County, deceased, being weak & infirm in bodily health, but of perfect mind and memory,
 do make and ordain this my last will and testament.

In the first place, as to what worldly estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me
 with, after payment of my funeral expenses, and all my just and lawful debts, I give,
 devise, and bequeath, and dispose of the same in the following manner.

Item 1st First, I give, and bequeath to my daughter Martha Saunders Miller my three
 negro slaves, Rose, Nelly and Jenny, and the issue & increase of the said female slaves,
 together with my horse, pig, stock of cattle, sheep, beds and bedding, furniture, jewellery,
 which I now have, or may be possessed of, at the time of my death. And all the
 rest, remainder and residue of my estate, of every kind & description, I give, devise and
 bequeath the said slaves, and their future issue, my horse, pig, stock of cattle, sheep,
 beds and bedding, furniture, jewellery, and all the rest and residue of my estate, I give -
 devise and bequeath to my said daughter Martha Saunders Miller, and to her heirs forever.
 But in case the said Martha Saunders Miller should die before marriage, or without
 children or issue, of her body living at the time of her death, then and in such case, I
 give, devise and bequeath the said female slaves, and their future issue and increase, horse,
 pig, stock of cattle, sheep, beds & bedding, furniture, jewellery, and all the rest and residue
 of my estate, to my sister Maria G. Bevire, during her life, and at the death of my
 said sister, it is my will, and I do hereby give, devise and bequeath the said negro slaves,
 Rose, Nelly and Jenny, and their future issue and increase, and all the rest, remainder
 and residue of my estate, of every kind, to John R. Ross, son of my esteemed friend Mrs.
 Eliza Lamb, of Bogart County, to him and his heirs forever.

Item It is hereby my will, wish, and my express desire, that at and immediately after
 my death, that my sister Mrs. Maria G. Bevire should take into her charge and
 keeping my daughter Martha Saunders Miller; and that she should continue in her charge
 and keeping until she arrives to the age of eighteen years, or until she is married.
