 I have given him — My wife and I have a third child
 of my wife, both real and personal, is equally divided be-
 tween my beloved wife, Mary Anne, and my children, each to
 have had their share. — My will is, that on the death of
 either of my children before marriage, or the age of twenty one
 years, my surviving child, or children, shall inherit the whole
 of the property, both real and personal, of the deceased one.
 My will is that on the death of all my children before
 marriage, or the age of twenty one years, that the whole prop-
 erty I have given them, both real and personal, shall be
 equally divided between my mother, and the children of my
 brother and sister, all of whom now, at present, residing in
 Scotland, except my brother Smaller and whom it may hap-
 pen, that I may have a brother or sister without free hold
 brother or sister to inherit equally with the children of my
 other brothers, and sisters, and mother, each and every of them
 to share and have alike. — I earnestly request my execu-
 tors to give particular attention to the education of my chil-
 dren, and as soon as they shall arrive to suitable age, I wish
 them sent off to complete their education, and placed under
 the care of some pious friend, who may guide their mother.
 I nominate and appoint my brother Smaller, Son to
 William Gordon executor of this my last will and testament
 witnessing all other and former wills and testaments, I declare

Codicil to my last Will.

Having, on reconsideration that my will, as it stands, was written
before I lost my child Donald, and thinking, from that circum-
stances, that it requires some attention, I do hereby will to my

during her life, & at her disposal at her death. I do hereby will and
bequeath her the plantation, with the use of every thing on it,
during her widowhood; but after her marriage it is wholly my
son Andrew's. If my son should die before he comes of age,
then his part to be disposed of, as in my will already written.
This Codicil I have written while in my sound reason.
