



To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:
Know ye, that in pursuance of the act for opening the land-office, and
in virtue of the powers in me vested, I have given and granted, and by
these presents, in the name and behalf of the said state, do give and grant,
all that tract or

parcel of land, containing one hundred acres, situated, lying and being in the County of Liberty, in the said State; and better and bounding small sides by vacant lands, having such form, shape and marks, as appear by copies of the same heretofore annexed; together with all and singular the rights, members and appurtenances thereof, whatsoever, in the said tract or parcel of land belonging, or in any wise appertaining; and also, all the estate, right, title, interest, claim and demand of the State aforesaid, of, in, to or out of the same.

To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, and all and singular the premises aforesaid, with their and every of their rights, members, and appurtenances unto the said Baxter Smith his heirs and assigns, to his and their own proper use and behoof, forever, in fee simple.

ing upon the account of the said administration, the same being
