4thly I give and bequeath to my daughter Barbary West Goodwin fifty acres of land part of the tract where on a new line coming of my son Henrys line to be her property during life

5thly At the death of my wife Barbary aforesaid I give and bequeath I give and bequeath to my sons Andrew & Henry West my daughters Catharine Ennis, Barbary Goodwin & Rachel Hembrow all the remaining part of my Estate. to be equally divided amongst them and to be theirs and their heirs forever except my daughter Barbara which at her death her part, given, is to be equally divided between my sons Andrew & Henry West. And I do hereby appoint my wife Barbary West my whole sole Executrix of this my last will and testament hereby revoking and disannulling all former wills by me made.
