 Who made me, And then I make and Declare
 this my last Will and Testament in form as
 follows, that is to say, First I Will that all -
 Just debts be Legally Discharged, I then Give
 and Bequeath to my Beloved Wife Nancy Roberts
 all my Estate both Real and personal to be hers
 Own during her life or Widowhood and
 then to be Equally divided Among my Surviving
 Heirs - as they come of Age -

Lastly I constitute and Appoint my
 Beloved Wife Nancy Roberts and
 her heirs to this
 my last Will and Testament -

ory, do Make And Ordain this my Last
Will And Testament, that, is to say I
Recommend to God who give it And my body
to be decently buried at the discretion of my
Executors

1st I Give And bequeath to my Daughter Bar-
bara Bently fifty Dollars to be Paid out of
my Estate After my decease as I have Given
her before.

2^d I Give And bequeath to my Beloved Wife Mary
Harpers four Hundred Dollars, with One
Negro Girl named Miley, One horse And
Saddle And One Cow And with such house-
hold And Kitchen furniture as she thinks
proper
