 of My Executors And Out of My Worldly estate
 Which it has pleased God to bless me With
 I Give And bequeath unto My Beloved Wife
 Nancy Moncrief All My plantation And
 Land Whereon I now live to be hers in during
 of her Natural Life or Widowhood together
 With Three feather beds And four new
 cows And Calves One spinning Wheel And
 One corn One cotton Wheel Capard grimmer
 And kitchen furniture two tables And six
 chairs, One Wagon And harness With all the
 farming Utensils And One horse And twenty
 two hogs With My Stock now And One shot
 gun And All My Crop of Wheat Which Are
 Now growing together With a One half of
 All Corn And potatoes Which Are Raised
 the present year With all my potatoes

Secondly I Give to My daughter Mary One
 bed And furniture Also One trunk as
 part of My Estate -

Thirdly My Will And desire is that
 the Remaining part of My Estate Which is
 Not herein Named ~~Shall~~ Shall be sold to
 the

the highest bidder for the benefit of the heirs and creditors -

And Lastly I do hereby Ordain And Appoint William Mansup And Arnold H. Jones to be My Lawfull Executors to carry into effect This My Last Will And Testament in Writings Whereof I have set My hand and this thirtyth day of April in the year of Our Lord one thousand Eight hundred And Eighteen Signed sealed &c

Lincoln County Wills 1800 to 1832

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George A. Zellner born in Spain
in the County Court John Zellner and
Andrew Zellner & being
duly sworn sayeth that they saw Arthur
Moncrief make his last will & heard him
as knowledge the Writings Instrument of
Writing to be his Last Will And Testament
& at the time of his so doing he was of a
sound disposing mind And memory to
the best of their knowledge And also saw
Moses Jones & John A. Zellner be Witnesses to the
same done to in open Court this second
day of November 1818
