that is to say first of all I Recommand My
Soul to God Who gave it And that My body

of my Executors and out of my worldly estate
Whith it has pleased God to bless me with
I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Nancy Moncrief all my plantation and
Land whereon I now live to be hers in during
of her Natural life or widowhood together
With three feather beds and four iron
bows and a Calver of young Chickens and
One Cow One Calf White Cap and Gurnet
and kitchen furniture two tables and six
chairs, One Wagon and Cart With all the
farming Utencils and One horse and twenty
two hogs Whith all my Stock here and one that
you breed All my Crops of Wheat Which are
now growing together Whith a one half of
All Corn and fodder which are raised
the present year Whith all my pasture

Secondly I give to My daughter Amy one
bed and furniture that can stand as
part of My Estate -

Thirdly My Will And desire is that
the Possession ~~of~~ of my Estate which is
not herein named ~~shall~~ shall be sold to
the

the highest bidder for the benefit of the living
and creditors.

Firstly And Lastly I do hereby Ordain And
Appoint William Moncrief And Arnold
Gaines to be My Lawfull Executors to Carry
into effect This my last Will And Testame
nt in Writing Whereof I have set my hand and
this thirtieth day of April in the year of Our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and eighteen
