 where I now live containing Two hundred
 And Forty four Acres together with all
 the stock I now have and more than head
 of cattle and seventy five head of Hogs
 Also the Household And Kitchen Furniture
 unto her during Life And after her death
 it is My Wish And desire that the Negro
 called named Spive should be set free
 And the Negro Woman named Mary and
 her four children Jay Jane Pitty Moses
 And Louisa I give unto my Brother Benj-
 amin Samuell And the Negro Girl
 named Henry I give unto My Friend -
 William M. Burman - I do appoint My
 Wife Elizabeth Samuell Executor And
 And Benjamin Samuell & William
 Burman Executors to this My last
