last will and Testament, and in the following manner.

I give to the Hands of my Creator I recommend my
soul with a full belief that his goodness & mercy as far as
deserving will be bestowed and to the earth my body to
be buried in a plain Christian like burial at the discretion
of my friends.

I give my worldly goods in the following
manner.

Item 1. I give my real and personal estate that my just debts.

debts, I owe being to Joseph B. Johnston, land for which
I hold a mortgage on a tract of Land for, and which my
friends Richard H. Long & Richardson Doctor has the
management of, and which I desire my Executor to
have the management and control as soon as the same
can be collected for the purpose herein specified.

Item 2. I desire that my son John Garbitt have out of
my estate the sum of one dollar -

Item 3. I give to my son William Garbitt the sum of one
dollar to be paid also out of my estate -

Item 4. To my son William Garbitt I also give the sum of
one dollar payable as the others before said -

Item 5. To my son in law Jordan Humber who intermarried
with my daughter Mary, I give the sum of one
dollar payable in the same manner as the above

Item 6th To my three sons in Law Lewis Buckley, who
intermarried with my daughter Elizabeth, Solomon
Wilborn, who intermarried with my daughter Rachel,
and William Feter who intermarried with my daughter
Margaret. For the love and affection I have
towards my Children, I give two hundred and
fifty acres of land more or less, which lies in the
County of Wilkes and State aforesaid on Cotton Creek
Tracts Creek - It being the one half of the tract of
land I purchased the 6th day of July 1782 from
Benjamin Welch as four hundred acres, this on
survey runs out five hundred acres, the half of
which I heretofore gave to my son William
Castrell, all of which will appear by reference to
the records of Wilkes County, I further give to my
said sons in law in consideration aforesaid, such tracts
or tracts of Land, that may be drawn in the con-
