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I, George Walker of the State
of Georgia, and County of Sumter being Well
in Body Not of sound Mind and Memo-
ry, do Make and Ordain this my Last
Will and Testament, that, is to say I
Recommend to God who give it and my body
to be decently buried at the discretion of my
Executors.

1st I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Bar-
bara Knittle 1/2 the Dollars to be Paid out of
my Estate after my decease as I have given
her before.

2^d I Give and bequeath to my Beloved Wife Mary
Walker four Hundred Dollars, with one
Negro Girl named Milly, one horse and
stable has been here with the such horse
and kitchen furniture as she thinks
proper

 his decease to be Equally divided between my five
 youngest Children that is to say Arnold Yellner,
 John Yellner, Sarah M. Good, Andrew Yellner And
 George Yellner, Share And Share alike,

3rd. All the balance of my property Which I have Not
 Given is to be sold at my decease And Equally
 divided between my five youngest Children,

4th. I Give to my beloved Wife Mary Yellner One feather
 Bed and ^{all such} furniture as she may choose to be
 her own, And at her own disposal,

5th. And Lastly I make And Ordain Elisha M. Good
 And John Yellner My Executors to Carry this My
 last Will And Testament, into Effect, Revoking
 All Other Wills heretofore made, in Writings Whereof
 I have set my hand And seal this second day of -
 November 1821.
