I do therefore Make Ordain & Constitute this my
last Will and Testaments as follows (to wit)

1st I Will that all my Just debts be paid out
of my Estate

2nd I Will to my beloved Brother Arnold Zebulon
one Hundred dollars to be paid out of my Estate
as soon as it can be conveniently Raised

3rd I Will to my beloved Brother John Zebulon
one Hundred dollars to be paid out of my
Estate as soon as it can be conveniently

Raised

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4th I Will to my beloved Sister Sarah M.
one Hundred dollars to be paid out
of my Estate as soon as it can be conveniently
Rraised

5th - I Will to my Niece Brother Andrew Zebulon
a two hundred dollar Note now in my posses-
- sion on Gaabron bulver of Hancock County
Which said Note is to be given up to Andrew
as soon as the Executors shall be authorized

6th - I Will to my beloved Wife Lemima Zebulon, all
the remaining parts of my Estate both real and
personal, (to wit) Three hundred acres of land
whereon I now live in the same name of land, also
one lot of land whereon I am Seventh of Lincoln
County, the said lots of Land is known by No.
225 in Henry County, & also four Negroes (to wit)
Moses, Ned, John, & Ellen all my children of my
Wife & all the crop in hand, & also all the plant
ations & tools of Entry - Land. (Continued)

And all the Household & Kitchen Furniture of
 Every Description and Kind
 Lastly I Will that my beloved Wife Gemima
 Zwolner, William Peter, & Harry Wheat be
 my Executors & Escentors to Carry this Will into
 effect - With the power of disposing of such parts
 of the Estate to pay the debts & Legacies as they may
 think most advisable, and so I Commit my
 Soul to good Hoping in Jesus Christ for Salvation
 Amen
