personal of Every description thereof dur-
ing her life - And Give the following pro-
perty (Viz) One Negro man by the Name
of George White borne by her father, One
Negro Woman by the Name of Fanny & her
Three Children And all her furniture Here
after - And One Negro Woman by the Name
of Lotty to Will & to do With as She may
please Together With Two feather beds And
furniture of her choice, One Desk, One Set
of Walnut Tables, Two bows & calico & One Horse
of her choice All this the Last mentioned
property Notice I Give, Now my Debt is to
paid out of the Balance of my Estate in
the following manner (Viz) I bequeath my
Executorial And my Executors With the power
of Selling And paying my debt With any of
my property by private sale as they may think
best to the quot. As if I my self Were a
Living to dispose of the same, meaning my
personal Estate Not Including that which
I have Given, And my Will & Desire is that.
