ordinary health of body & mind Menory Thence
thence to to give for the same, but calling to mind
the mortality of my Body and knowing it is
appointed for me to die, so make con-
sideration appoint this my last will and Testament, —

(Viz) Principally and first of all I give and be-
quest my soul unto the hands of god, who gave it, &
my body to the earth to be buried in a decent, Chris-
tian Burial at the discretion of my Executors, nothing
scattering but to receive the same again by the mighty
powers of god, when soul and body shall be reunited
at the general resurrection and reaching such noble
estate with which it hath pleased god to bless me
with, I give and dispose of in the manner, here
following (Viz) —

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I give and bequest unto my wife, Rebecca, Lily
Jenny, William, Isaac, children, and I leave unto
my wife, caring for her natural life, rather
and Edmund, after her mother's death he
estate and also seven hundred dollars in cash
and I give the property that I had my daughter, Fanny,
after her death unto her following children —

(Viz) Nancy, Seyler, Maryann, Mary, & Phoebe.
I bequest I give and bequest unto my child
Mr. Peyton the following property (Viz) the share
of the tract of land which he now has and also
the following Lewis, Nancy, John & Peter —

This also I leave unto my daughter Nancy caring
for her natural life and after her decease, I give &
bequest unto her legitimate children, the following
Mary, John, William, Alfred, James, Prudence
& Henry, James & Prudence is now in his
possession — continued

Fourthly - I give unto my daughter Nancy the following negroes, Charlotte, John, Ben, & Jell curing her natural life and at the decease of Jell & Benjamin the 1/2 negroes to her legitimate children -

Fifthly I give unto my beloved wife Phibes curing her natural life, all the residue of my estate of whatever nature or kind, and at her decease, I give unto my son Peyton one third of the estate that I have but, to my wife curing her life and one third to my daughter Nancy as is mentioned in the above will, and to my daughter Nancy one third part as is mentioned in the above will.

I do hereby hereto all former wills & Testaments by me made and or her by appointing this to be my last will and testament, and I do hereby appoint my son Peyton Thaw, to be my executor of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 18th day of November, 1820
