First I Give And Bequeath to My dear and

Loving Wife Barbara Tillars My plantation I Live on and part of the plantation I purchased of the Estate of William Nolan decd. Including all My Buildings on the plantation Where I Live containing Seven Hundred Acres be the same more or less - Beginning on a Dog Wood corner Near William Wright Line And thence along Wright side, John Fowler & Richard Patterson to a Stake corner thence along Hobbs Jones Line, Stokes's Line to Black Oak corner thence on Jones Line thence along Jones Line to a pine corner thence along Jones Line to a pine corner on the land I purchased of William Nolan decd. thence a straight Line to the Dog wood corner

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Ernestson, Anderson Afford To see Henry
 Each lot is to be Valued As Near Equal As
 possible And Equally divided Between My
 children that is to say, my son Solomon
 my son John, my daughter Mary, ^{my son} Peter
 my daughter Elizabeth my ~~son~~ ^{son} Jacob, S. Bellows my daughter Catherine
 my daughter Sarah, And if Each lot of
 Negroes amounts to Six Hundred &
 sixty five Dollars to each of the above Men-
 tioned children And there is any more
 Negroes left After making up the above
 mentioned ^{value} children, then my daughter
 Nancy Sator is to have An Equal part
 with the Rest of my children, In case there
 is any Negroes left to divide As I have
 given to ~~my daughter Nancy~~ ^{my son} ~~the~~ left,
 me to the amount of, Six Hundred and
 sixty five Dollars in Negroes And other pro-
 perty - Thirdly & Lastly the Balance of
 my Estate, Both Real & Personal property
 is to be Equally divided Between my
 children And Also the property that I
 have left my Wife after her death is to also
 to be divided Between my children that
 is to say my daughter Nancy my son Solo-
 mon, my son John my daughter Mary
 my son Peter, my daughter Elizabeth my son
 Jacob, S. Bellows, my daughter Catherine, my
 daughter Sarah, - This I make & constitute
 this my Last Will & Testament, Renouncing
 all Others Wills -
