I Jemmy Flournoy of the County of Lincoln and State of Georgia, Being Weak in body but of perfect mind & making thanks be given unto God, calling unto Mind the Mortality of my body, And knowing that it is appointed for all persons once to die do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament — That is to Say principally And first of all I Give And Bequeath unto my Soul unto the Hand of Almighty God that gave it And my body I Bequeath to the Earth to be Buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors, Nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same by the mighty power of God. And I Give unto my Estate the sum of it unto the pleasure of God to bless me in this life, I Give devise And dispose of the same in the following manner & form —

First I Give unto David Blaser & That He as married my daughter Peggy. I Give him and his wife to be Paid out of my Estate And paid to him by my Executors Upon After Married — Secondly I Give to my Son Thomas Flournoy the sum of \$1000.00 to be Paid to him out of my Estate &c. I also Give to my son Thomas Flournoy my share of the land I own — I Give the third 1/3 of the share of my daughter Jenny York, that she may perhaps have as well as those she has ready has now been the Trust of land I now live

Live on appointing a guardian, Blacklock and
Behanston it being the last of said time to
me by my deceased husband John Florence -

And the Balance of my Personal Estate, To
be disposed of as follows, Viz, To be Equally
Divided Among all of my surviving Children
And a part of my beloved children viz, -
To James Jones that married my daughter
Polly, To Willis Jones that married my
daughter Franky, To David Blacklock that
married my daughter Peggy, To my son Thomas
Florence, To the Heirs of my son William
Florence, To the Heirs of my son John Florence
And To James York that married my daughter
Jenny. To each of the Above I have And
shall be the of the Balance of my Property
As above stated, viz, To David Black-
lock five Hundred dollars, To Thomas Flo-
rence five Hundred dollars And my Wagon
And hind Gear, And To the Heirs of my daugh-
ter Jenny York precisely as above stated

Lincoln County Wills 1800 to 1832
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I Likewise do constitute, make And
ordain My son Thomas Florence Executor
to carry this My Last Will and Testament
fully into Effect, And I do hereby utterly dis-
own Revokes And Disannuls All and every other
former Testaments Wills Legacies, bequests of
Executors by me in any Way or manner
Willed & Requested, Ratifying And confir-
ming this And No Other to be My Last Will &
Testament - All Writings Whereof I have my hand
set.

First. I Give to my Will beloved
Wife Fanny Jones All my Estate both Real &
personally of Every description thereof dur-
ing her life - And Give the following prop-
erty (Viz) One Negro man by the Name
of Jesse White borne by her father, One
Negro Woman by the Name of Fanny & her
Three Children And All her Furniture
after - And Give to my Son by the Name
of Lotter to Will & to do With as She may
please Together With Two feather beds And
furniture of her choice, One Desk, One Set
of Walnut Tables, Two bows & calico & One Horse
of her choice All this the Last mentioned
property Notice I Give, now my debts is to
paid out of the Ballance of my Estate in
the following manner (Viz) I clothe my
Executive And my Executors With the Power
of Selling And paying my debts With any of
my property by private Sale as they may think
best to do. As if I my self Were
Living to Dispose of the same, meaning my
personally Estate not Including that which
I have Given, And my Will & Devise is that.
