Lincoln County Wills 1800 to 1832

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In the Name of God - Amen
I, Philip Carter, one of the State of Georgia
(and County of Lincoln County) do hereby certify and attest
(ing) of Mind and Memory. (Philip Carter for the same) do
Constitute, and ordain this to be my last will and Testament
desiring it may be lawful, Ordained Constituted as such, I suppose,
I begueth my soul to God that gave it, beseeching his most
generous acceptance thereof, through the all sufficient merits of
Jesus Christ, or Mediation and redemption, In and through his
its will acceptable to the divine Majesty of Heaven, and as to
my body I desire it may be buried in the earth in a Christian
like manner, and as to my worldly Estate, I will and bequeath
it in Manner and form following, (to wit),

I have and have sold to the said Philip Carter, being
two heads and four quarters of Corn, and one sack of
Wheat and one sack of Oats, and three Churns, one pot one
oven, one spit, and one Saw Mill, to be his forever, and
I also leave for all that, Part of my Tract of Land
beginning at the branch where the old road that came
from Robert Henderson's crossing the branch there through
the upper edge of the old gate fence at Stripes
contains one

Lewis Parkes line thence along Lewis Parkes to John
 Lockhart, Land, thence into Stokes line, thence along
 Stokes line, to Roberts, Henderson Line, thence along
 to me beginning during her life or widow
 hood, then the remaining parts of my property to be sold
 and my just debts to be paid, and the balance to be
 equally divided between my surviving children by my Grand-
 children after named, and lastly I do hereby nominate con-
 sults, ordain and appoint John Hardy Esq & Lewis Parkes as
 Executors to this my last will and testament, utterly disan-
 nulling and revoking any former will or wills, ratifying
 and confirming this and nothing to be my last will and
 testament - In Witness whereof I do hereunto set
 my hand and seal this 18th day of January in the year
 of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty seven -
