Then I Give and bequeeth unto My Son John
it being in said and in paying one fifth of the Value of
Said Land unto My Son Mathew Spinks one fifth to Enock
Spinks one fifth to Isaac Spinks and one fifth to
Nathaniel Spinks to be Delivered At the Marriage
or Decease of his mother Mary Spinks —

Then I Give unto My Daughter Sally one fellow beed
and furniture and one Cow and half to be Delivered as
aforesaid. Also the sum of forty Dollars in Cash —

Then I Give unto My Daughter Susanna Spinks one
fellow beed and furniture and one Cow and half also the
sum of twenty Dollars in Cash to be paid unto her as
aforesaid —

Then I Give unto My Daughter Rebecca ~~the~~
Graved the sum of thirty Dollars in Cash to be paid
unto her as above —

Then I Give unto Nancy Worley one Cow and calf
and the sum of thirty Dollars Renting out one
Rifle Gun —

Then the Rest of all My Stock of horses Cows and
hogs together With all My plantations Wares
to be Divided Amongst my five youngest sons to wit
With all my houses to be further that shall be
Remainder of my Estate —

Then I Constitute and ordain Jacob Spraker
my Wife and Moses Mathews Sr and Micajah Hendrix
Executors to this my Last Will and Testament in
Witness whereof I have hereunto set My hand and
