In the name of God Amen I, Job Hunter of the
County of Lincoln and State of Georgia being very feeble
and weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and
memory thanks be given unto god calling unto mind
the mortality of my body and knowing that it is
appointed for man once to die, do make and ordain
this my last will and testament that is to say first
c. pally and first of all I give and recommend my soul
unto the hands of Almighty god that governs and my
body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent
Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors, nothing
doubting but that the general resurrection I shall mine
the same again by the mighty power of god and
as Touching such worldly estate where with it has
pleased god to bless me in this life I give devise and
dispose of the same in the following manner and
form

First I give and bequeath to Mortha my beloved
Wife the whole of my property during her Natural
life and after her death I give it to my children to be
equally divided between them all I do desire that as soon
as may be all my debt and lawful debts shall be paid
I also leave my loving wife Mortha & John Handy
my brother executors to this my last will and testament
and I do hereby certify a solemn oath and swear it

all and every other for our Testament with, and Executor, by me in any way upon records written and signed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament.

In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this third day of June in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight hundred and Six.
