William fifty dollars in a horse as soon as each of them be-
comes of age to be raised out of my estate, I do hereby appoint
My son John Phipps my Executor and my Wife Milly Phipps
my Executrix of this my last will and Testament hereby
revoking all former wills by me made, In Witness
Whereof I have unto set my hand and seal the 1st of May
in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred &
Twenty five &
