 perty shall be kept together until my two chil-
 dren born to me ^{Lincoln County Wills 1800 to 1832}
 George Albert & Mary Larissa Walker divided
 for my Executors of this my Last Will & Testam-
 ent My beloved Wife and my friend William
 Harper - In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand and seal this 19th day of January 1817

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Sworn Agreeable to Law they depose & say that they have seen John Price but have not heard him acknowledge the Within Instrument of Writing to be his last Will and Testament and at the time of his dying he was of sound disposing mind and memory to the best of their knowledge -

Sworn to before two Justices of the Superior Court on & for said this 4th day of December 1816
