buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of
Executors nothing doubting but at the general resur-
rection I shall receive the same again by the mighty
power of God. And as touching such as worldly affairs
wherein it has pleased God to bless me with in this
life I give and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form.

1st I wish all of my just debts to
be paid

2nd I give unto my beloved daughter Elizabeth
Eckols all of my clothing and bed and furniture
3rd I give unto my beloved son Isaac Willingham
one half of my money and notes that I have in
hand and the other half to be equally divided
between my grand children the heirs of John Willing-
ham if one a cripple if he should remain so
his name is James Archy I wish him to have two
shares to the others one and I further wish the mon-
ey to be put out on interest and they paid their part
equally as they become of age

4th It is my wish that my
negro girl Matilda and her increase to be sold &
equally divided between all of my heirs. I wish
Reuben Willingham's heirs, Caleb & Nancy to have
all of this part. It is my wish that William Will-
ingham's heirs shall have his part equally divided
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this 7th day of March 1820
