 Knowing it was once appointed for all men to die
 & being in my perfect mind & memory do make
 and ordain this my last will and testament
 that is to say first to pay all my just debts
 I lend to my dearly beloved Wife Judith Gray
 for Aycock the whole of my real and pers-
 onal estate which I am or may be possessed of
 whatsoever kind it may be during her natural
 life or marriage & at her death or marriage
 to be divided among my four children and
 my grand son William Augustus Anthony
 as follows (viz) My wish is for my land
 to be valued or sold and the profits arising to
 be divided between my two sons James Edward
 Aycock & Lorenzo Richard Aycock at my Wife's
 death or marriage, also my personal property
 as follows

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I give to my son James Edward Aycock and his heirs for ever also to Betsey
 Terry Robinson my garden Peter Phetitia Thune
 and their increase to her and her heirs forever
 also I give my daughter Susanna, Eliza Aycock
 her son Scotty Charlotte Ransom & Patty to her and
 her heirs forever, to my son Lorenzo Rich Aycock
 I give Zilphia Jane Rachel Richman & Ann
 to him and his heirs forever

Also I give to my grand son William Augustus
 Anthony two Negroes Henry & Noura them & their
 increase one black one red & furniture also one
 cow & calf but if he dies before he comes of age
 the Negroes & other is to go to our four children
 herein before mentioned

I hereby appoint James, Edward, & Th. Amels as
 the executors of this equarian for my son James
 Edwards Aycock. I will also at the death of my
 Wife or Marriage that all my other property of
 whatever kind it may be shall be equally div-
 ided between our four children herein before mention-
 ed out of which James has had a horse saddle
 & bridle and Henry has had one feather bed and
 furniture also one cow and calf but this division
 is not to take place in none of the property unless
 her death or Marriage or she should be disposed
 to let them have any part thereof while she is
 living. Lastly I leave my ^{only} Judith Crawford Ay-
 cock Executrix and James Edwards her brother
 Executor to this my last will and Testament.

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Meaning of the word "I" in the above will is
 Richard Aycock

 Maria who being duly sworn deposes and saith Richard
 Aycock the deceased acknowledged to himself and
 the other subscribing witnesses that it was his hand
 writing, subscribed to said will that himself and
 the other witnesses subscribed the said will in the
 presence of the testator as witnesses and that at the
 time of his so doing he was of sound mind and

sound to in open court
 this 30th day of May 1824
