

I give to my son Samuel Johnston whom he now lives I also give to my wife Leannah my two negroes namely ~~James & Julia~~ to have and to hold during her natural life and also all the stocks of every kind her life except a long remainder fully I give to my son James Johnston to be delivered to him next fall at the appraisment also Samuel Johns to have his hand at the appraisment also I wish and desire my

Wife Leannah to have and to hold all my household furniture and all plantation tools during her life and then to be sold and Equally divided amongst all my children so that all of them may share an equal proportion

And lastly I constitute and appoint Zachariah Spier, William Evans Esq. and also my wife Leannah Johnston as Executors to this my last will and testament

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twelfth day of March one thousand Eight hundred offine and in the twenty ninth year of the American Independence

In the name of God Amen I Robert Lovett of the State of Georgia and County of Lincoln being weak and frail of body but of perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and

fore following To wit

first after discharging all my just debts I give unto
 bequeath unto my affectionate wife Patsy during her
 Widow hood six Negroes, To wit; Lot, Mall, Tean on Tomm
 Fan & Sunday, also my Stock of hogs Cattle and horses
 excepting a two years old horse and a mare two years old
 and a little gray horse which may be holden all of
 which to be continued on the plantation together with
 all working utensils and house hold furniture
 excepting one feather bed a pear for my near chil-
 dren, Jordan, Patsy, Robert, Betty, Sally, Hardy,
 Absolam, Polly, and Emey which is now with me at
 the time of this marriage or going to themselves, as also
 one negro a pear at the same time. To my daughter
 Nancy Mackberry I give and bequeath a certain
 negro girl named Lida. To Jordan my son I
 give and bequeath a negro boy named Plumber, to
 Patsy my daughter I give and bequeath a negro
 girl named Eastern,

To Betty my daughter I give a negro girl named
 Milly

To Robert my son I give a negro boy named
 Squire.

and to Sally my daughter I give a negro boy
 named Isaac.

and for my other four children viz; Absolam
 Hardy, Polly & Emey if there should be an increase
 of the above mentioned Negroes to be left on the
 plantation then and in that case the four last
 mentioned children is to receive one a pear
 of the said increase of Negroes but in case there
 should be no such increase as aforesaid then
 the said Absolam, Hardy, Polly and Emey shall
 be entitled to the value of one such negro share
 as the other have received in property or Cash, and
 at the death or inter marriage of my wife Patsy
 as hereby given and bequeathed unto my daughter

Peggy Hancock the sum of two hundred twenty two dollars & fifty cents as her part in full of my my estate which she is thus entitled to receive and not before and the remaining part of my estate both real and personal I leave to be equally divided between my two children to wit; Francis, Louisa, Nancy, Betty, Sally, Robert, Hardy, Absolam, Polly & Henry at the death or interment of my wife each child shall therein receive their equal part and such of them who may be under age their part shall remain in the hands of Louisa Lovvett and John Travell my and I do hereby nominate and appoint Nancy Lovvett my wife, Louisa Lovvett and John Travell my Executors and Executors to carry this my last will and testament into full effect Witness my hand & seals this 18th day of September 1806.
