In the name of God Amen I Thomas Eloge of Lincoln County and State of Georgia being in perfect sense but weak in personal health make this my last will and testament & revoke all others made before by me.

In the first place I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Milly Eloge the following property to wit: Mary, Isaac & Isaac and Hannah also their heirs of house & land in Lincoln County

and the young bay Colt. also fifteen head of cattle such as
 she shall choose out of my stock, also the stock of hogs
 sheep and geese and all my household furniture and
 plantation tools that may be proper for the use of the
 plantation also my land and plantation for her to have
 and to hold during her life or widowhood for the pur-
 pose of raising my children and giving them liberal
 education the balance to be sold to pay all last demands
 and the balance to put to interest by the executors and
 distributed among my children equally as they become
 of age or marry, and its further my will and desire
 that my wife Philly Glaze shall give to each and every
 one of my children, fully only excepted the sum of fifty
 in such household furniture or stock as she may
 think proper and at her death or end of widowhood the
 whole of the property real and personal to be sold and
 equally divided among all my children except those
 that may not be of age nor married shall have the
 sum of fifty dollars more to make them all equal
 and as such I recommend myself and dear family into
 the hands of almighty god. this being my last will
 and Testament given under my hand and seal this
 11th of February 1805.
