Single County & being worth of body but sound in mind, do
make and constitute this my last Will & Testament (Ver)

Item 1st I wish all my just debts to be paid;

Item 2nd I wish all my property to remain in the possession
of my beloved wife Milly, and to be managed to the best adv-
antage untill my youngest child arrives at the age of twenty
one year;

Item 3rd I also wish as my children come of age or marry, that
they should have a Negro, and such other property as my
Wife can spare at Education;

Item 4th If my said wife should marry before my youngest
child comes of age, then the property to be equally divided
between her and the children;

Item 5th Should my said wife die before my youngest child comes
of age then the property to be equally divided among my children;

Item 6th I wish the land on which I now live to be sold, and after
purchasing a place to suit my wife, whatever money is
left, I wish to be put out at interest untill my young-
est child comes of age, and then to be divided

Item 7th If before my youngest child comes of age, my wife, I wish
to be sold and the money disposed of as above;

Lastly, I do make and constitute my Wife Milly Lyons, Edmund
Lyons & Major Lubark & Samuel Crump Executors to this
my last Will & Testament, Whereunto I have set my
Hand this thirteenth day of August Eighteen hundred and
Twenty Three;

State of Georgia, In the name of God Amen, I Thomas
Lincoln County, Deputy of the County and State aforesaid
as above written, being of sound mind, and coming to mind
the mortality of my body, and knowing the uncertainty of
a death and that it is appointed for all men once to die, do
hereby constitute & ordain this my last will & Testament:
In the first place I recommend my soul to God who gave
it and my body to be decently buried in a christian like man-
ner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter to be named
with regard to the worldly goods it has been blessed & prosper-
ously bestowed on me, I give and bequeath in the following manner
(to wit) First I desire that all my Just debts be paid out of
my Estate in Lincoln County. Will 1800 to 1832 my wife
Judith Dupuy, the mother of the said land and plantations
whereon I now live during her natural life, unless otherwise
disposed or disposed of by myself in my lifetime, I do stand
unto her my said wife Judith Dupuy two negroes, that is
to say a negro man named Toby and one negro woman
named Kate, Also I stand unto my wife Judith Dupuy one half
of my stock of horses, cattle, hogs & sheep, Also all my Plant-
ations & tools, Also as much of my household & furniture fur-
niture as she in her pleasure may think proper during
her natural life or widowhood, and in case she my wife
Judith Dupuy should intermarry that then I in that case
two thirds of the above named property, except the negroes
Toby and Kate which is hereafter devised away, shall be
taken from her & by my Executors sold at public auction
and the proceeds thereof to be equally divided share and
share alike between my children Bartlett Dupuy, Maria
Dupuy, & Charlotte Curry, & John Curry & I intend to leave
to them and their heirs forever.

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
