 Owens. My Negro Mose & Dicy & her youngest
 Child Lincoln County Wills 1800 to 1832
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 Will & Desire is my Wife should live on this
 My Plantation, with my Children To wit
 Amy, Thomas & Andrew Elizabeth Penney
 Batheny and as they come of Age or Marry give
 them the following Leases hereafter Bequea-
 =thed. Then my Desire is that: My Negro Woman
 Betty and her youngest Child Esther, should
 remain on the My Plantation to support my
 Children above mentioned School them &c.
 At the Death of my Wife my Desire is all the above
 mentioned Negroes to be Equal. Divided Amongst
 all my Children, Charles Excepted

I then, I give to my Grandson William Brown son of John Brown one hundred Acres of Land At the Upper End of this tract, on the North side of the Creek for ever —

I then, I give my son John Brown and Dolly for ever All the use of his son's Land above mentioned till he comes of age — — —

I then, I give my Daughter Elizabeth for ever Nancy Grace all my land on the South side of the Creek Where they now Live two Acres Excepted Most Convenient to the Mill Seat, to be equally Divided Laying two hundred Acres to be Divided. Be it Mannered Each Party having one hundred More or less to be divided for the part. They now Live on for ever — — —

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I then, I give unto my Daughter Anne Brown my Negro Girl Ginny and one gray horse saddle, Saddle and one feather bed & furniture for ever — — —

I then, I give unto my son John Brown my Negro Girl Phoeby. When he comes of age or comes of age for ever — — —

I then, I give to my son Andrew Brown my Negro Boy Stephen and one feather bed & that his Grandfather gave him for ever when he comes of age — — —

I then I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Owens one
Negro girl Eliza and one feather bed & furniture when
she comes of Age or Marriage —

I then I give to my Daughter Penning my Negro
girl Mary and one feather bed & furniture when
she comes of Age or Marriage — — —

I then I give to my Daughter Nathaniel Owens —
One Negro girl Charlot. And one feather bed &
furniture, After my youngest child comes
of Age or Marriage I give to my sons Sandy
Thomas & Andrew Owens all the Remaining
tract or parcel of Land Laying on the North
Side of the Creek together with the two Acres
excepted on the South side of the said tract
to be equally divided between them — — —

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N.B. My devise is my Remaining Stocks of horses
cattle &c. hogs. house hold & kitchen furniture
Plantation Tools Corn & provender shall
Remain on the plantation for the support
There of My devise is that Henry Jones be my
Acting Executor To which I set my
Name this 24th Day of March 1800
