 And Tenements house hold Effects Debts And Mov-
 able Effects During her Widowhood And I Also App-
 oint My sons Robert And James And constitute
 Make And Ordain them Sole Executors of this My
 Last Will And Testament And at her Death the
 Land to be Equally Divided Amongst My sons,
 And All My Movable property to be Equally Divided
 Amongst All My Children And I do hereby Attely
 declare And confirm And annul all former Testam-
 ents, Wills Legacies Bequests, And Executors by me
 in

in any way wise before named and Bismuth. Ratifying this and No other to be my Last Will and Testament, In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Twenty second day of August One Thousand Eight and Ninety -
