body, but of a sound mind and dispo-
sely Memory, but willing to make the most
valuable of my body And knowing that it is
appointed for All men to die, so make
and Ordain this my Last Will and Testa-
ment - That is to say first of All I recom-
mend my soul to God Who creat it, And
my body to the Earth to be Buried in a
Decent Christian like manner at the
Discretion of my Executors to be hereafter
named, As Touching my worldly Estate
Where with it has pleased God to Bless me
in this short time devised And dispose of
the same in the following manner -

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Item 1st I Give and bequeath unto
my Executors my All my phat. debts out of
my Estate -

Item 2^d I Give and bequeath unto
my beloved Wife Mary Dooley And her
Heirs forever which she has had by the
Vice - My dear Mary Elizabeth Sarah Ann
John Lewis, the tract of Land Whereon
I now live to be equally divided between or
sold so my Executors may think best, And
on equal division make of the money it
may bring to them And their heirs forever -

Item 3^d I Give unto my dear above
named & certain Mary Child by the Name
of Jack And her Heirs to be their that
the said Mary Child of Lawfull age or May
Marry to whom What may be thought a propo-
riate

properly liable, part of her income so if she
 should have to share and their heirs forever, But
 in case this first child should have no issue
 then my five daughters have a several years
 namely the to be sold and the money the said
 said to be equally divided among my five
 daughters above named -

Item 4. it is my will & desire that my wife
 and her five daughters have all my stock & them
 cattle, large sheep plantation Tools of every dis-
 ception house hold & kitchen furniture for the bene-
 fit of Raising her five daughters above named

It is my further desire that such property as
 my Executors may think it necessary to have to
 be sold the money appropriated to the use and
 benefit of my five daughters above named

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Item 5. I give unto my son Benjamin
 Andrew one Negro Man named Amos, to him and
 his heirs forever, I also give unto my son
 Thomas, one of my Working Apparels, I give unto
 the heirs of Nancy Peak, my son Gilbert, Samuel
 William, Sarah, my daughter Rebecca Rhodes
 the heirs of my daughter Maryant, I would and
 my son Joseph, to each of them one dollar
 to be raised out of my estate and paid by my
 Executors and no more of my estate -

Witness by an Act passed by the State of Georgia
 at Milledgeville during the last session of the
 Legislature of said State Relative to the distribu-
 tion of certain lands lately obtained in the
 sale by said Act. Was appointed to be laid off in
 tracts and divisions for the citizens of said States,
 and whereas by the provisions and stipulations

of said int. I was Entitled to your share in
 said land setting which said setting is not yet
 known but I pending now it is my Will And
 desire that, should my land be known from
 the said share or sales in the said land sell
 my share and in that case that the same shall
 be equally divided between my beloved Wife
 And my five children named as above.

Lastly it is my And desire that, All the
 debts I owe And demands, together With all
 the share in Action And the Best Dividends
 And Remainders of my estate, Real And personal
 Not herebefore devised the same I Will
 And Bequeath to my said Wife And my five
 children Above named And their Heirs.

I nominate And Appoint David C. Cagle
 And William Hill Executors of this my Last.
