Item. I give to my daughter Mary Gethum our Negro Woman named Aggy and her increase which she now has possession of to her and her heirs forever. Item. I lend to my daughter Susannah Bailey our Negro boy Samus and one bay horse called Lolly and one Cow & Calf and one hundred dollars during her Natural life them to be equally divided amongst the heirs of her body.

Item I give to my daughter Lucy Postels our Negro boy Luther that she now has in possession and one Cow & Calf and one hundred and twenty five dollars to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Mitty Mary my Negro Woman Phillis and one hundred and fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Fanny Jones my two Negro girls namely Isabella & Betsy and her & her sisters to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Sally Jones my Negro Woman Violet and Tom her child one feather bed & furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give to my 3 grand Children heirs of my son John Jones one & five hundred dollars to be equally divided between them but to remain in the hands of my Executors until they come of age and money and not to bear interest until they shall be of age money to them and their heirs forever.

Item I give to my son William Jones 175 acres of land more or less the bounds to run as follows it being the place where I now live beginning on Newford Creek on Thomas Walton line County Wills 1795-1808 line to Lewis

I do hereby give and bequeath unto the said son Henry all the remaining tract of land where I now live or the place where James Bird lives, 175. more or less beginning in the road at the head of the said stream thence down the said stream to the said Branch to the said Creek thence up the said Creek, a long survey line thence along the said line to Anthony's line thence by Barton's line thence as the line goes the said road thence up the said road to the beginning at the head of the stream also my Negro man Gabriel and one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.
