 Mind the Mortality of my body and know-
 ing that it is Appointed for all Mankind
 to die do make and Ordain this My Last
 Will And Testament, That is to say Princip-
 ally And first of all - I Give & Recommend
 My soul into the hand of Almighty God that
 gave it, And my body I Recommend to the
 Earth to be Buried in decent Christian
 Burial At the direction of My Executors
 Nothing doubting but at the General Resur-
 rection of the Dead I shall be raised again by
 the Mighty Power of God - And as Touching
 Worldly Estate Which with it hath pleased
 God to bestow upon me in this life I Give devise
 And dispose of the same in the following
 Manner And form

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First I Give to my beloved Wife gran
 Nolan During her Natural Life four
 Hundred Acres of Land Including the
 Building Wherein I now Live, the tract of
 Land to be Bounded as following Beginning
 at the Mouth of Opatim's Spring Branch
 up said Branch to a second fork up to Par-
 adise's corner tree, down to a large Oak
 Road to two post Oaks corner trees
 back

Both Mark. - Run on the Boundary Line,
 Running on the line by Jones & Bellars keep-
 ing the line to the corner Bound on Wright
 the Land Near a pond thence keeping
 the Old line to Barkhshales Road keeping
 the line between J. Showman & Paradise
 thence to the Beginning at the Mouth of the
 said Spring Branch, Making four hundred
 Acres be the same more or less within these
 Boundaries described or pointed out -

I also send to my Wife from Nolan during
 her Natural life all my Stock of Horses
 Except my Team that Belongs to my Wagon
 Also one yoke of Steers & my Ox cart, Also
 the one half of my stock of cattle to be
 Divided by my Wife & one of my
 Sons ~~the said~~ ^{Lincoln County Wills 1800 to 1832}

 to be divided by the Two mentioned one
 half to my Wife & the other half to be
 disposed of hereafter - And the Stock of
 Sheep, goats & hogs to be divided in the same
 manner as the stock of cattle has been
 described - I also send to my Wife the
 following property, one Hophorn & including
 the furniture within it, Two Tables she
 to take her choice also the kitchen Table
 also three father, Beds & furniture also three
 chests that is already her own and one
 large trunk also the one half of my
 kitchen furniture & one large iron
 stands in the kitchen & also the chairs
 belonging

Belonging to the house, And also the third part
of my Working Tools plantation Tools also
the one third of my Luns Excepting the
Piggen Luns & also Two New Molds for Meat
my plows also my Thrashing Machine I
lend to my Wife also I give to my Wife Two
Hundred & Three dollars in cash to be her own
property, also Two New hives & two Skates
Vessels also Some eggs also my Riding鞭
& Harness Belonging to it I also give to my
Wife also four Meat Pickers, Two large flower
Kernels & Two Meat Pickers & a half dozen prunes
two potatoes and the one half of the salted
Meat Bacon & pork and the one half of
the Hogs Lard & the one half of the corn
now on hand, I also give to my Wife four
also I give to my Wife four new Axes & a new
And I give to my Wife four new Axes & a new
forks & Spoons that was already my Wife
and also three bed stands I give to my Wife
also I give to my Wife four all the sugar &
coffee that I now have on hand, also one Wire
Cistern that is already here I also give to my
Wife the following Negroes Old Jack and his
Wife Motley, Little Jack & Annina, Mary-
Antoine Adam & Anne, Fanny & John Lee
and James & George & Peter & Rachel the
I give to my Wife they were already here -
It is to be under stood that the property
that I have lent her Excepting what has
been lent to her during her lifetime
LIFE or Widow hood in case she should
marry

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Making the property that was not here to be
run to and be divided among my children
as will be hereafter mentioned and I also
give to my wife two candlesticks which
have already been at marriage -

It is my wish and desire that all
my property that I have not given or sent
to my wife from before both Real and
personal should be Equally divided
between all my children, Except Lettie
Wright & the part that might fall to her
to be Equally divided between her & her
two children Franky Tate & William
Maddy each the one third And at the
Intermarriage or Death of my wife
from the property that I have sent her
except such as she has by her at
her marriage with me should be Equ-
ally divided among all my children
Except Lettie Wright & with the ex-
cepted And the part that might fall to
her to be Equally divided between Lettie
Wright & Franky Tate & William Maddy

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And it is my wish that the property
that I have left to be Equally divided
among all my children with the except-
ance are as follows viz, Savannah Jones,
Nancy ~~Phillips~~, Nellie Log, William Rob-
son, James Nolan, John Nolan, George
Nolan, Francis Jones & Thomas Nolan
and Lettie Wright with the exceptance

As I give to my son Thomas Nolan and
He then had a furniture a good bed & a
bed stand to be his when call'd for, this
to be his over and above what might
come to his part on the first or second
division -

I likewise do constitute and appoint
my friend Robert Ware Esq^r, my son William
Nolan & my son James Nolan & my friend
Arthur Frazer Executors of this my last
Will and Testament, And I do hereby utterly
disallow revoke and disannul all and
every other former Testament Wills Legacies
Bequests & Executors by me in any Way before
said Wills And Bequests Ratifying &
confirming the same by my last
Will And Testament
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In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & seal this twenty fourth day of
January in the year of our Lord one thou-
sand Eight Hundred and fourteen
Signed sealed published pronounced
and declared by the said William Nolan
as his last Will and Testament
