Bequeath All Other parts of said Land as
above Mentioned to be Equally Divided
Between my Two said Daughters - Thirdly

I Give And Bequeath to my son James
Paradis the same Stock and furniture
Whereon I now Live at the death of his
Mother And if he I Give And Bequeath
my said daughter James Paradis

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Caputed Hair Which My Beloved Wife Eliza-
 beth is at this time pregnant With the
 Negro Girl call'd Sarah & her Increase
 At the Death of these Mothers Together With
 such furniture as these Mothers shall be
 proper to give them up Left before ^{the}
